Cambridgeshire Lodge of Provincial Grand Stewards

From its inception and Consecration in 2016, the Cambridgeshire Lodge of Provincial Grand Stewards was planned to be the premier and most prominent Lodge in Cambridgeshire, to fulfil the need for a Lodge of service and support to the Provincial Grand Master and the Province of Cambridgeshire in general; as operated in every other Province.

A honour: The Right Worshipful Provincial Grand Master very much hopes that an appointment to Provincial Grand Steward will be considered a honour; indicating that the individual has been identified as someone with the drive, ability and the time and willingness to engage fully with Provincial activities and to offer much-needed assistance to the Provincial Executive in the delivery of the various Provincial functions.

Once a Steward always a Steward: The implication being that no matter how exalted a brother eventually may become, he is always entitled, and encouraged, to wear the red apron in the Stewards' Lodge or when on duty as a Steward.

By invitation only: Appointment as a Provincial Grand Steward will be by invitation only, and solely in the gift of the RW Provincial Grand Master. It is expected that all newly appointed Provincial Stewards will become joining members of the Cambridgeshire Lodge of Provincial Grand Stewards and will engage fully in the delivery of the tasks delegated to it;

Provincial Events: Any past or present Provincial Steward may be called upon to assist in a variety of tasks and duties especially when the Provincial Grand Master convenes major assemblies. The most important of these being the annual Provincial Grand Lodge / Grand Chapter meeting in June of each year; along with other events such as the Festival of Carols. Whilst discharging these duties, Stewards will work under the direction of the Senior Steward of the day who in turn will work under the overall guidance of the **Provincial Grand Secretary** and **Provincial Grand Director of Ceremonies** and their respective teams.

On these occasions, Provincial Stewards may be called upon to act as act as ushers; arranging brethren in their proper places, checking and recording their attendance before they enter the Temple and ensuring brethren fortunate enough to be receiving honours are directed to their appointed seats. Similarly, assisting with Provincial guests, Grand Officers and also the 'meet and greet' team, moving furniture and assisting in the set-up of the Temple, and of course to assist at the Festive Board of any Provincial event, including the serving of wine, if required.

Provincial Stewards may also be called upon to assist the Provincial Executive at Installation meetings, Consecration meetings or even to assist other Lodges in ceremonial matters as required.

Wearing a Red Apron: Each and all of the tasks undertaken by a Provincial Steward are vital to the smooth running of Provincial events to ensure that the Province is seen in the best possible light and anyone wearing a 'Red Apron' should be considered a highly respected member of the Province of Cambridgeshire.
